



## DAY 1 Read 1 John 1:5-7, Acts 2:42-47 & Matthew 5:23-24

*[5] This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light, and there is absolutely no darkness in him. [6] If we say, "We have fellowship with him," and yet we walk in darkness, we are lying and are not practicing the truth. [7] If we walk in the light as he himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin.*

1 John 1:5-7 CSB

*[42] They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread, and to prayer. [43] Everyone was filled with awe, and many wonders and signs were being performed through the apostles. [44] Now all the believers were together and held all things in common. [45] They sold their possessions and property and distributed the proceeds to all, as any had need. [46] Every day they devoted themselves to meeting together in the temple, and broke bread from house to house. They ate their food with joyful and sincere hearts, [47] praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. Every day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.*

Acts 2:42-47 CSB

*[23] So if you are offering your gift on the altar, and there you remember that your brother or sister has something against you, [24] leave your gift there in front of the altar. First go and be reconciled with your brother or sister, and then come and offer your gift.*

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## DAY 5 Read 1 John 3:16, John 13:34-35, Matthew 25:40 & 18:20 & Hebrews 10:24-26

*[16] This is how we have come to know love: He laid down his life for us. We should also lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters.*

1 John 3:16 CSB

*[34] "I give you a new command: Love one another. Just as I have loved you, you are also to love one another. [35] By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."*

John 13:34-35 CSB

*[40] "And the King will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'*

Matthew 25:40 CSB

*[20] For where two or three are gathered together in my name, I am there among them."*

Matthew 18:20 CSB

*[24] And let us consider one another in order to provoke love and good works, [25] not neglecting to gather together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging each other, and all the more as you see the day approaching. [26] For if we deliberately go on sinning after receiving the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins,*

Hebrews 10:24-26 CSB
